- 1. Identify any 2 people around you, starting from the periphery of your own home parents and grandparents, uncles, aunts or other acquaintances, whom you consider as a standing ideal of success. Seek an appointment with them for an interview, cordially ascertaining their availability as well as suitability. Prepare a list of questions to be asked beforehand. Your questions may revolve around the following pointers:
- early childhood experience/s
- academic achievements
- *source of inspiration*
- any Eureka moment or the turning point of life
- *the success mantra (the thumb rule of success)*
- *if given a chance, will the interviewee want to pursue some other career. If so, why.*
- ❖ To add a zing to your interview, you may add a rapid fire round while winding up, for which you may pick a few quick fixers like favourite book, favourite author, a 'yet-to befulfilled' wish, an ideal personality et al.
- * Record the interview following the below mentioned guidelines and submit a copy of recorded interview in a labelled pen drive to the class teacher latest by 3rd July, 2018.
- *Prioritize a set of objectives and questions.*
- *Dress neatly and appropriately for the situation.*
- Develop a checklist of the "tools" needed during the interview.
- *Arrange an appropriate location.*
- *Introduce yourself, your project and the objective behind the interview.*
- Begin with your list of questions.
- *Develop more depth/complexity as the interview develops.*
- *Keep a track of time as the interview should not exceed more than 3-5 minutes.*
- *Express sincere appreciation in the end and conclude.*
